

To ensure an optimistic future for Washington County, government must be effective and efficient in adapting to an ever changing environment and responding to the fluctuating demands of residents and commerce.







# Municipal Breakdown





# History

On March 28, 1781, Washington County was created by an act of the Pennsylvania Assembly, and named in honor of General George Washington. Carved from the western section of Westmoreland County, it was formed to allow the inhabitants of the area west of the Monongahela River to have more convenient courts and public offices, rather than the inconvenience and hardship of being so far remote from the seat of justice.

The town of Basset later renamed Washington, served as the site of the first County Courthouse, a log structure built in 1787. The present day Washington County Courthouse, completed in 1900 by the F. J. Osterling Company of Pittsburgh, is registered as a national landmark.


The Whiskey Rebellion, one of the most famous events of early American history, took place in Washington County when David Bradford, noted attorney and community leader, directed area farmers to rebel against the federal excise tax on whiskey passed in 1791. Governor Henry "Lighthorse Harry" Lee, father of the Civil War General Robert E. Lee, smashed the rebellion when he led federal troops into Washington and Allegheny counties. Bradford's Main Street residence, built in 1788, remains a historical site maintained by the David Bradford House Association.

The residence of Dr. Francis J. LeMoyné, a leading abolitionist and founder of the Western Abolition Society (1824), is preserved by the Washington County Historical Society as another historic attraction.

The National Pike (Route 40), America's first federally built transportation system, runs through Washington County and exhibits numerous antique shops and historic points of interest, such as the Century Inn of Scenery Hill.


A few other amenities of present-day Washington County include: California University of Pennsylvania, Washington & Jefferson College, three modern hospitals; fourteen school districts; sixteen libraries; Monongahela Aquatorium; three county parks; Washington County Airport; the Meadows Racetrack and Casino; the Washington County Fairgrounds; PA Trolley Museum; Consol Energy Park - home of the Washington frontier league baseball team; the antique shops of Scenery Hill and West Alexander; Westerwald Pottery; Duncan and Miller Glass Museum; Little Lake Dinner Theatre of Canonsburg; Meadowcroft Rock Shelter & Museum of Rural Life; and

First Niagara Pavilion.

Washington County's population has remained consistent with over 200,000 residents for the last century. According to the 2010 census, the county's population is 207,820 with 106,785 females and 101,035 males.

The majority of the population can be found in the urban and suburban area of the county: the City of Washington and surrounding areas, the Monongahela River Valley, the Chartiers-Houston area and the Peters/Cecil areas.

As the 2010 census findings show, there were 42,684 persons age 18 and under; 122,859 persons between 20 and 64 years of age and 36,366 persons 65 years of age or older. The minority population totals nearly 13,649 or 6.6% of the total population.

The average Washington County citizen is 43.6 years of age and resides in a home with a median market value of \$130,300 (2010 census).

The ability to move people and goods from one location to another in a manner that is effective, efficient and safe is one of the primary goals of our transportation planning. A comprehensive transportation system is actually an integration of subsystems modes that provides access and mobility to residents and travelers. Such subsystems are usually associated with the most familiar mode of transportation -- the roadway, but it also encompasses rail, waterways, air, sidewalks, trails and public transit.

Washington County has 2,875 miles of roadway infrastructure. Interstates 70 & 79, which intersect just outside of the City of Washington are major north/south and east/west crossroads connecting the region to much of the United States. The crossroads provide easy access to many of the major cities in the area including Pittsburgh, PA; Cleveland, OH; Morgantown, WV and Erie, PA as well as the PA turnpike. Route 22, traversing the northwestern sector of the county, also acts as an important connection with the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, the City of Pittsburgh, the panhandle of West Virginia and eastern portions of Ohio.

The Mon/Fayette Expressway is a 65-mile limited access highway connecting Pittsburgh, PA to Morgantown, WV (I-68). When completed the expressway will provide revitalization opportunities to many of our older communities in the Monongahela River Valley. The expressway parallels the Monongahela River and is intersected by three major Highways -- Route 51, I-70 and Route 40.

Another proposed project that will impact Washington County and the region is the Southern Beltway -- a 30 mile, \$1.3 billion expressway -- it will serve as a beltway around the City of Pittsburgh. The project will connect the Monongahela Valley to the Pittsburgh International Airport north to the turnpike.

Washington County is served by 141 miles of track owned by five railroad carriers: Allegheny Valley Railroad (AVR), CSX Transportation (B&O), Norfolk Southern Rail Company (NSRC), Pittsburgh & Ohio Central and Wheeling & Lake Erie (WLE).

Along the eastern border of the county, the Monongahela River provides a link to ports along the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. An estimated 37 to 50 million tons of coal, petroleum and other materials are shipped annually along the Monongahela River.

The County Airport, located south of the City of Washington on Route 18, operates under the direction of the County Commissioners through the Washington County Redevelopment Authority. Since the airport can accommodate business jets, many companies operate aircraft from the facility; as a result, the Washington County Airport ranks as the fourth busiest in Southwestern PA, generating more than \$16 million in economic activity annually. With the recent improvements at the airport, such as the Instrument Landing System (ILS), airport operations have increased to over 40,000 landings and take-offs.



Washington County owns and operates three parks: **Cross Creek Park**, (2,830 acres), **Mingo Creek Park** (2,289 acres), **Ten Mile Creek Park** (25 acres) and 17 miles of **Rails to Trails** (Panhandle Trail). Additionally, numerous other municipal parks and facilities and state game lands contribute to the recreational opportunities available to residents and visitors. Washington County boasts eighteen golf courses including **Quicksilver** Golf Club and **Southpointe** Golf Club. Southpointe hosts the Pro Am Mylan Classic.

The **Meadows Racetrack & Casino** features harness racing and numerous stake races. The casino offers a wide variety of slots, video poker and table games. Guests can enjoy music from local and national entertainers in one of the lounges. Friends and family may join together for a game on one of the 24 state-of-the-art bowling lanes.

**First Niagara Pavilion**, is a 23,000 capacity amphitheatre which is located in Hanover Township, and showcases musical artists from classical to contemporary venues. The **Pepsi-Cola Roadhouse**, also located in Hanover Township, provides musical artists and compliments the entertainment with a dining atmosphere. Unique to the area and the first of its kind in the United States is the **Monongahela Aquatorium**, promoting "Rockin on The Mon" summer concert series.


Numerous festivals and workshops take place throughout the year that not only add to the recreational experience within our County Parks, but also serve to educate visitors and natives alike. Our rich national history is highlighted annually by the **National Pike Festival** (May), **Whiskey Rebellion Festival** (July), as well as the ever popular **Covered Bridge Festival** (Sept.). Other featured activities throughout the year include the annual Hickory **Apple Festival** (Oct.) and **Pumpkin Festival** in Houston (Oct.). Additionally the City of Washington hosts the **Main Street Farmers Market**, open every Thursday, mid May through October which offers delicious, locally grown or produced food and talented musicians. As a highlight to all of these activities, a visit to our annual **Washington County Agricultural Fair** (August) proves to be both educational and entertaining. ## **HEALTH CARE**

---

Washington County has 3 hospitals: the Washington Hospital, Canonsburg Hospital, and Monongahela Valley Hospital. In addition to the general hospitals, the county has 12 skilled nursing facilities along with 9 outpatient clinics. There are 378 practicing physicians, 135 dentists and 13 separate ambulance services. These divergent and essential medical services help ensure excellent health care for all of Washington County's citizens.

## **POLICE & FIRE PROTECTION**

---

Washington County is served by 49 volunteer fire departments and 4 paid departments, which are located in North Strabane, Peters Township and the City of Washington. The Pennsylvania State Police, which operates Troop B Headquarters in the City of Washington, serves as a welcome addition by assisting our municipal police departments.

## **EDUCATION**

---

Washington County has 14 public school districts, 36 non-public schools, 2 vocational-technical schools, 3 trade and vocational schools and 2 institutions of higher education: California University of Pennsylvania and Washington & Jefferson College. Waynesburg University, Community College of Allegheny County, and Community College of Beaver County also offer locations at three convenient centers in Washington County.

## **COMMUNITY FACILITIES**

---

Washington County has 14 public libraries and 3 private libraries: California University's Louis L. Manderino Library containing 317,000 volumes (not including electronic books, videos, CD's, DVD's and electronic databases,) the Washington & Jefferson College's U. Grant Miller Library containing 127,000 volumes and the Washington County Law Library containing 25,000 volumes.

Numerous religious denominations are represented within the county with over 290 churches and synagogues.

Social and civic groups are also active in all parts of our county, helping with environmental issues as well as assisting the elderly and caring for our younger residents.






Washington County has enjoyed an increase in civil labor force, from approximately 83,700 in 1980 to just over 108,000 employees in 2008 (2008 Census). The increase has been primarily in service industries. According to census data, from 1980 to 2006, the number of people employed in service related industries jumped from just under 22,000 to well over 43,000, by far the largest economic boom in our county. The transition started in the early 1990's with the addition of the First Niagara Pavilion, California Technology Park and the Southpointe Business Park. Over the last 10 years, the transition has continued with the planning and site development of three new industrial/business parks: Alta Vista, Starpointe and Southpointe II; various brownfield developments, and retail centers. Service-based businesses that located to these sites helped to draw other businesses due to the variety of support they offer locally.

While service based industries have become our primary employment sector, manufacturing still remains an important part of the economic structure in Washington County. With the closing and automation of factories in our county, and with the rise in education and technology, the shift to service-based industry was the natural progression of employment in Washington County. Service industries have developed to support our remaining manufacturing industries. Companies in the service industry can range anywhere from engineering and surveying firms to health and education to restaurants and hotels. In Washington County, health and education based services are the major occupation in the service sector, making up about half of all service businesses.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Washington County has approximately 5,400 industries, employing over 79,000 people in diverse areas ranging from manufacturing to business services. Additionally, over 15 industrial parks including Southpointe, Alta Vista, and Starpointe contribute to the economic development of the county. With the continuing popularity of mixed-use industrial parks, Washington County is keeping pace through the expansion of Southpointe and Starpointe; highlighting continued success and a bright future for Washington County.

Efforts to promote economic development throughout the county include projects in the Route 22 corridor, such as the development of Starpointe Business Park which services the northern areas of Washington County. Likewise, Alta Vista and California Business Parks service the Monongahela Valley. The growing availability of public sewer, water services, and other utilities and infrastructure has allowed Washington County to continue to promote economic growth for all regions of the county.


Over 240 manufacturers employ about 8,900 people. Similarly, approximately 1025 wholesale and retail establishments employs in excess of 13,300 people; 143 real estate companies employ over 1200 people, and more than 3100 service industries employ over 38,000 people. Reviews of these numbers reveal true diversification among types of businesses located in Washington County resulting in a secure economic base and a solid foundation for the future of our county.

The residential and commercial construction industry in Washington County has continued to steadily grow, thanks in part to the development of the Northern I-79 Corridor, which includes Interstate 79, Route 19 and the surrounding areas. Communities such as Peters Township, Cecil Township, Chartiers Township, North Franklin Township and North & South Strabane Townships have shown steady increases in both residential and commercial development.


